III- Background

Juliette AGBO, a one-month-old baby, died in the city of BANTE, central Benin, on January 16, 2020 from congenital malformations linked to nutritional deficiencies. The lack of money prevented Juliette from receiving due postpartum care (medical and nutritional care), which caused her death before the eyes of her poor and helpless mother as a single parent who had to bear all the costs and charges alone. In such a situation, Tabe Jeanne will do everything she can to save Juliette's life by mobilizing funds, people and the community to ensure her survival. The Foundation was born from this idea about Tabe Jeanne's social engagement and the story of Juliette AGBO. We are a highly dynamic team and have a rich diversity of expertise, including but not limited to financial managers, project and community experts, scholars, and fundraising professionals who are committed to good causes in Benin and West Africa. Currently, the Foundation is made up of 120 members.

V- How We Add Value

- **Service provision** (achieving community growth, resilience and development through community engagement opportunities that we offer, direct service to the poor & needy, donor service, consultancy or expert service, event organizing like workshops and charity campaigns amongst others, and strategic partnerships that we create);
- **Philanthropic Advocacy** to secure more funds and significant grant resources for a poverty-free, equitable and sustainable West Africa;
- Awareness making through communications.

VI- Successful Donor-Funded Projects (What has been achieved so far)

"W4C" is our notable project. "W4C" or "Water4Change" is funded by KfBiA e.V. (Germany), Water for the World Foundation (Germany), Anne Frank Fonds (Switzerland) and the friends of the Tabe Jeanne Foundation (international). Through this multi-year project (2020-2025), we worked closely with local communities in water-scarce environments in Benin and Togo to cope with climate change and to combat climate migration, hunger, thirst, diseases, girls' and women's suffering and exclusion, school dropouts and child exploitation by building boreholes and managing water resources for schools, farms, health centers, and households in rural and remote settings. W4C particularly addressed maternal and child under-nutrition, under-five morbidity and mortality, droughts and low yields of agricultural produce, severe dehydration, the deterioration in living conditions of households, trafficking in persons and forced marriage that's particularly true for girls and women in water-poor areas. 52870 lives have been saved and impacted by this project so far.

By involving local communities in the management of boreholes and their impact, we transformed them from potential threats to passionate advocates for water access and for groundwater protection. Through innovative capacity building, regular monitoring and evaluation, and local management committees, we successfully reduced incidents or risks of borehole malfunction, water-borne diseases and food insecurity, amongst others. By partnering with local communities and empowering them to actively engage in local water management, we created a sense of ownership and stewardship, ensuring the long-term sustainability of the initiative. Given the impact of this project, it has been renewed or extended for the 2025-2040 period.

Skills for job: This project created freedom and an opportunity for socioeconomic integration for girls aged 14 to 17 years who escaped electoral violence in 2019 and 2021 in Benin and on their move get caught up in sex trafficking, bullying, rape and sexual assault, forced marriage, forced labor, economic exploitation, and ethnic discrimination.

This project, funded by Stelp e.V., tackled the phenomenon of sugar daddies, high risk of early marriage, exposure to HIV/AIDS, gender-based violence, discrimination, and marginalization, street life, unemployment and social isolation by providing 60 girls with a livelihood, in particular a vocational training in sewing.

The project provided the appropriate facility in the commune of Abomey-Calavi, South Benin, sewing skills for beneficiary girls, psychotherapy (psychosocial support), one-on-one mentoring, life coaching and personal development, peace education, entrepreneurship training, recycling in literacy and arithmetic for life and work, market studies and strategies for girls, income model, business and market contracts for girls, training on relevant topics (customer strategy and marketing, financial management, conflict prevention and resolution in a cooperative, business and social communication, saving money, dividend sharing, etc.), and girls' rights education for families and communities.
